The courses are based on the latest scientific research, end-to-end planning, and the consistent development of professional skills.</p> <p>Languages: Russian as the state language of the Russian Federation and the main European language: English/ German/ French /Spanish.</p> <p>The program also involves further optimization of the educational process by increasing a number of elective courses to improve the quality and variety of the major, which ultimately will lead to even more successful subsequent integration of graduates into the professional environment, their competitiveness at the labor market; by further introducing modern distance educational technologies and e-learning into the educational process, which will facilitate the instruction of those with disabilities.</p> <p>This educational program is built on a modular principle of constructing content taking into account the requirements of educational standards to higher education in the given area of study (45.03.01 Philology), the Standard for the design and implementation of educational programs at SFedU and demonstrates the mechanisms that ensure a flexible educational path.</p>	<p>Careers: The young specialists in the field of foreign philology can work as translators during conferences, business negotiations and private meetings; become good literary translators; provide translation/language support and do tour guiding activities in the tourism sector; apply language and literature knowledge in organizations of secondary and professional education, organizations of additional professional education. In addition, the young people with a bachelor's degree in Foreign Philology can work as administrative and staff assistants, press secretaries, PR managers, international journalists, and editors. The philologists with knowledge of two foreign languages can carry out professional activities almost everywhere: in government agencies, publishing houses and commercial companies, in advertising agencies, scientific and bibliographic departments of libraries, cultural departments of museums (as employees providing language support). 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The concept of the program meets the international standards for teaching philological studies, which implies a balance of general theoretical, methodological and practical courses implemented by leading specialists of the Institute of Philology, Journalism and Intercultural Communications.

The workload of the given educational program is 240 credits, including all types of classroom and independent work of the student, practical training and the quality control of mastering the program by a student. The indisputable advantage of this educational program is the fact that more than 50% of courses are taught in a foreign language, chosen by the student as the main language studied, in addition to the practical course of the main and second foreign languages.

The curriculum involves mandatory implementation of project activity. In the first year, there is a subject called An Introduction to Project Activities, and the students present a project. In the second year, the students present a term paper (yearly essay) on one of the theoretical courses and a project. In the third year, a term paper (yearly essay) is provided. At the end of their studies, the students write and publicly defend a graduation thesis. Practical training in obtaining primary professional skills (tourist guide practice) provides students with theoretical and practical training, gives initial practical experience, and creates the conditions to shape practical competencies.

Translation and teaching training aimed at obtaining professional skills in the third and fourth

years of study involves providing an environment for implementation of skills and competence acquired in the classroom.

The curriculum consists of the following units:

- Unit 1 - Courses (modules) - 216 credits;
- Unit 2 – Practical trainings - 18 credits;
- Unit 3 - State Final Certification - 6 credits.

The total workload of study is 240 credits. The maximum time load of learning sessions is 54 academic hours per week. The maximum classroom load is 27 academic hours per week. The proportion of elective courses is more than 30% of the elective component of Unit 1 “Courses”. The time load of lectures does not exceed 55% of the total time load of classroom lessons.

Considering the social and technological trends, the program combines proven methods of traditional language training with technologies of a practice-oriented project-task approach to education.

The main features of the curriculum are:

- the modern paradigm of foreign language education, built on the principles of communicative, intercultural, personality-oriented and activity approaches, and developed with regards to the educational and professional needs of students and graduates of the program;
- flexible pathway of academic development with options.

The program is designed in such a way that a student can plan, shape and adjust their individual educational path, namely:

- to choose a second foreign language (English, German, French, Spanish);
- to choose a university mobility module (UMM) for study in the 2nd and 3rd years (UMM is an opportunity to study a minor course, for example: media and mass communication, web design, psychology and others);
- to study a large number of subjects in a foreign language;
- to choose a place for practical training;
- to participate in the project, where the 2nd foreign language is the means of carrying out research and / or project activities;
- to choose a field and topic within the framework of the graduation thesis;
- to present the results of research work at international student conferences and scientific events in Russia and abroad, where the main language is the first or second studied foreign language;
- to choose a further educational and career path based on seminars, workshops, trainings, meetings with employers and leading experts in the chosen professional field;
- to obtain additional certificates confirming professional qualifications.

It is important that the educational program provides an opportunity to study at a wide range of master's programs, which are implemented by foreign and Russian universities in the chosen language as the main and / or 2nd foreign language (English, German, French, Spanish).

Typical units of study may include:

- Basics of Classic and Germanic/Romance Philology;
- General Linguistics;
- Project Activities;
- First Foreign Language;
- Second Foreign Language;
- History and Theory of Foreign Literature;
- Methods of Philological Research and Literary Analysis;

- Language Education;
- Intercultural Studies.
